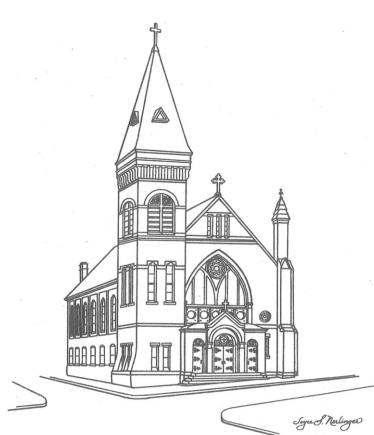

## May is Mary's Month

May, the month in which the earth springs into bloom and we start thinking about planting gardens, family picnics and making vacation plans. It's also the Month of Mary. For centuries, the Catholic Church has set aside the entire month of May to honor Mary, Mother of God. Not just a day in May, mind you, but the entire month.

The tradition of *Tricesimum*, or "Thirty-Day Devotion to Mary," came into being during the medieval age. The idea of a month dedicated specifically to Mary can be traced back to baroque times. It was in this era that Mary's Month and May were combined, making May the Month of Mary with special devotions organized throughout the month. This custom became especially widespread during the nineteenth century and remains in practice until today.

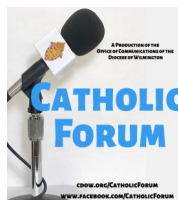
