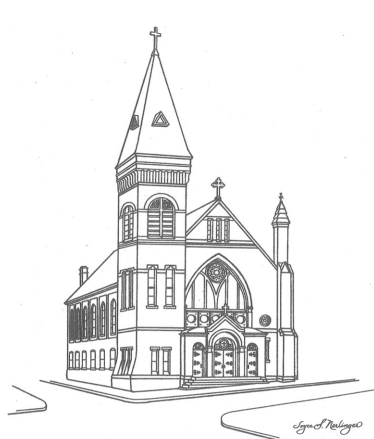

Contact Your Representative

Once again, a bill to legalize physician-assisted suicide is being brought before the Delaware General Assembly. The bill (HB 140) has been voted out of committee and is on the “ready list” to be voted on by the entire House. This endangers some of our most vulnerable brothers and sisters - the elderly, the disabled, and the ill.

Our opposition is rooted in the Church’s belief in the sanctity of life and the dignity of the individual. Efforts on the part of the Catholic community, other faith groups, medical professionals, Saint Francis Healthcare, and advocates for persons with disabilities, kept this legislation from becoming law in recent legislative sessions. We need to do so again!
