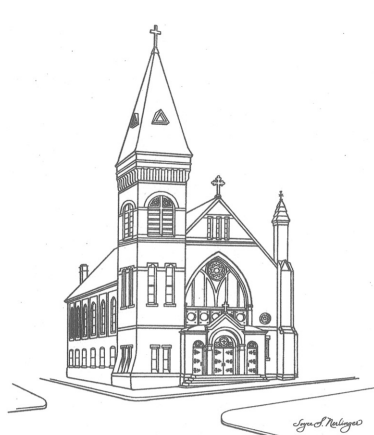

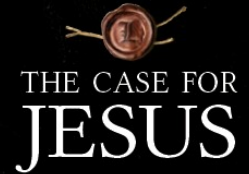

Born in 1581 France, as a young priest he was captured by pirates who carried him to Africa. Sold into slavery, he was freed when he converted his owner.

He became a chaplain to galley-slaves and founded an order of Priests to undertake the works of charity. In order to help poor girls, invalids, the insane, sick and unemployed, he and St. Louise de Marillac founded the Congregation of the Daughters of Charity. St. Vincent worked tirelessly to help those in need.
