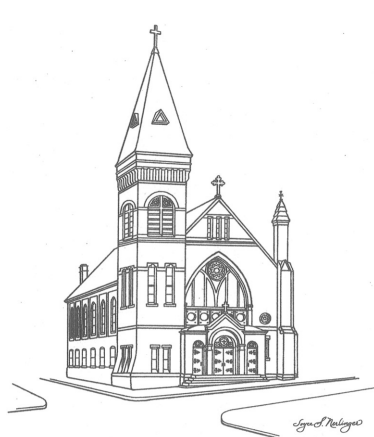

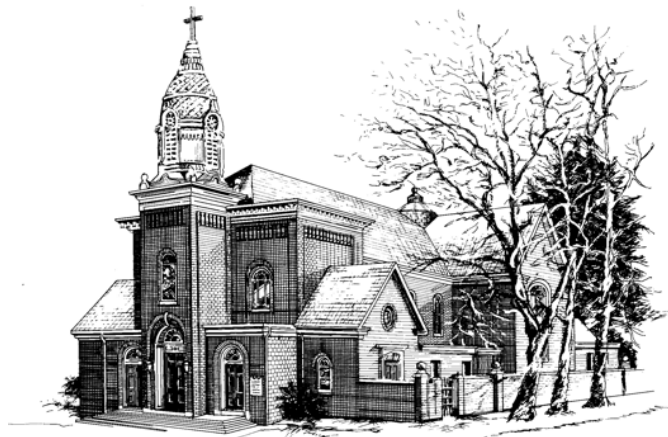

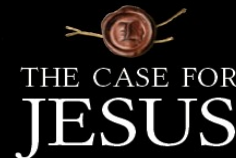

## Friday, October 13th is the feast of *Saint Edward the Confessor*

On the death of the Danish king, Canute, in 1042, he was called to the throne of England, which he accepted dutifully and held until 1066. His saintly bearing made him a popular sovereign, and his actions even more so.

Unable to fulfill a vow to embark on a pilgrimage to Saint Peter's tomb without leaving his subjects vulnerable to attack, his vow was commuted by the pope to the rebuilding of Saint Peter's Abbey in Westminster, where he was buried upon his death a week after its dedication. Edward died on January 5, 1066, and was canonized in 1161.
