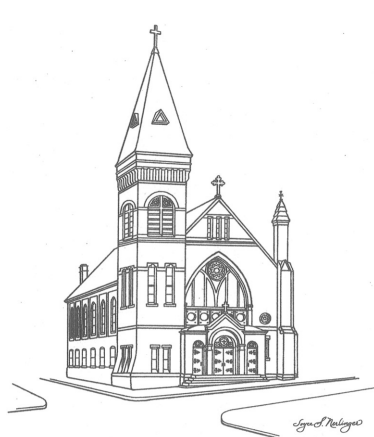

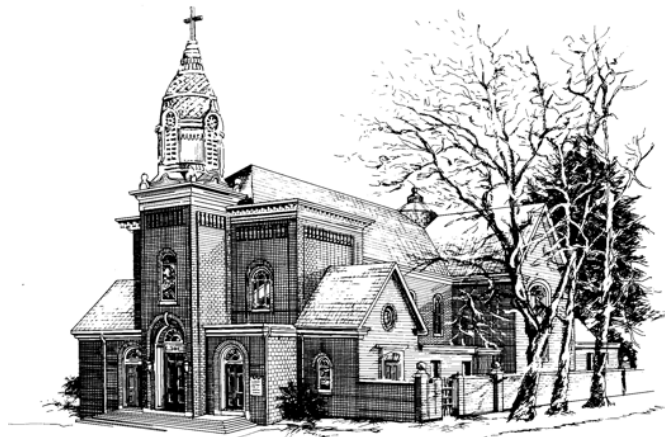

Friday, November 17th is the feast of *Saint Elizabeth of Hungary*

After her marriage in 1221, Elizabeth conscientiously fulfilled her duties both toward her royal husband and as a servant of God. During the night she would spend long periods in prayer. She put herself at the service of widows, orphans, the sick, the needy.

After the early death of her husband, Elizabeth laid aside all royal dignities in order to serve God more freely. In 1228 she took the veil of the Sisters of the Third Order of St. Francis. All her strength and care were now devoted to the poor and the sick. Young in years but rich in good works, she slept in the Lord in 1231, only 24 years old.

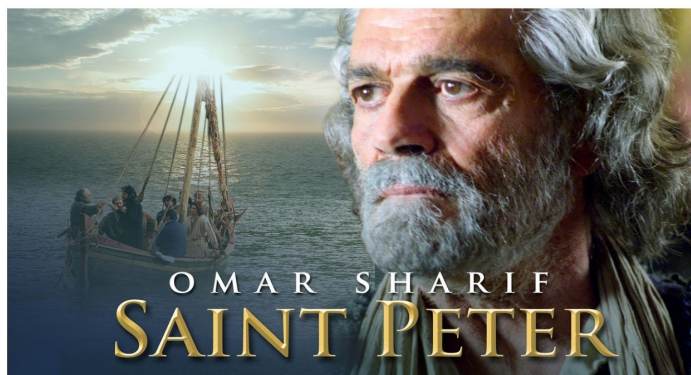
