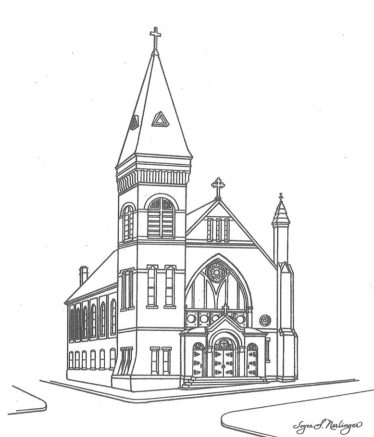

January 22: That Christians in America may be one, in union with the Chair of Saint Peter.

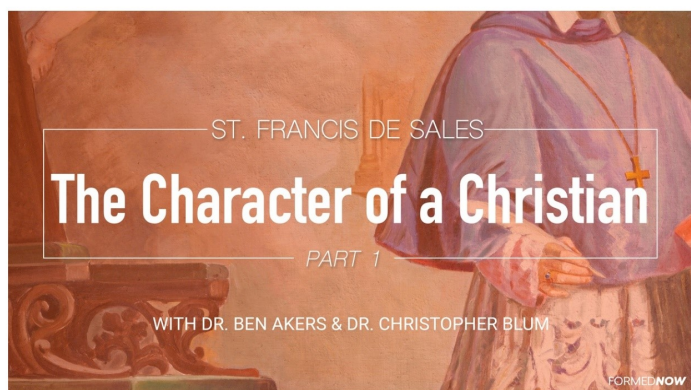
January 23: That lapsed Catholics will return to the Sacraments of the Church.

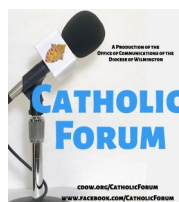
