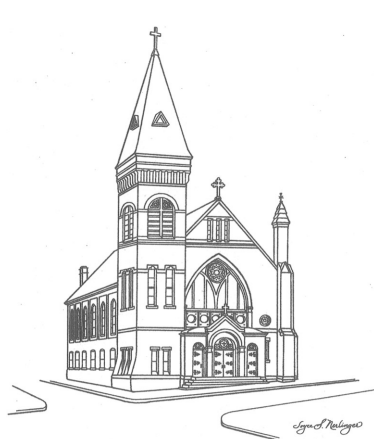

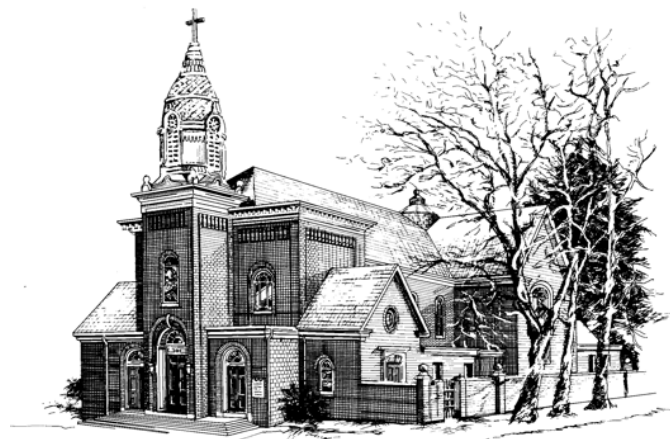

Saint John Bosco

Ordained a priest on June 5, 1846, he founded the oratory of St. Francis de Sales. At this time the city of Turin was on the threshold of the industrial revolution. Gifted as he was as an educator and a leader, Don Bosco formulated a system of education based on "reason, religion and kindness." He conducted workshops for the tradesmen and manual laborers, schools of arts and sciences for young workers, and schools of the liberal arts for those preparing for the priesthood. In 1868 there were 800 students involved in this educational system. To ensure the continuation of his work, Don Bosco founded the Society of St. Francis de Sales (Salesians), which was approved in 1869.

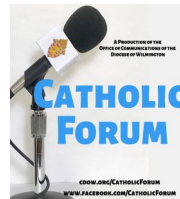
