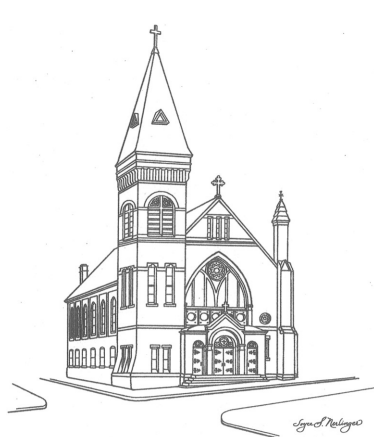

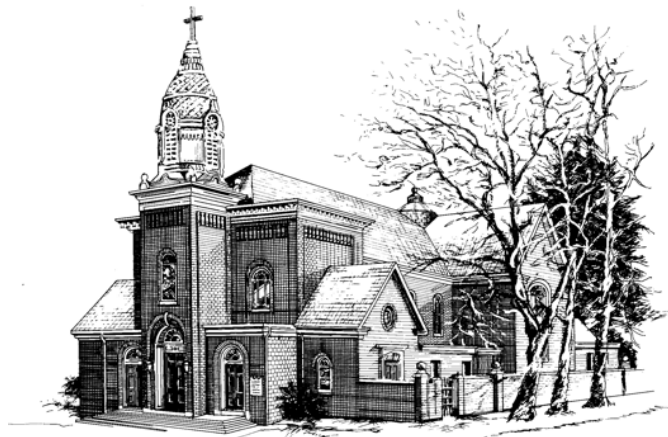

Saint David of Wales

David was the son of King Sant of South Wales and St. Non, became a priest, studied under St. Paulinus on an unidentified island for several years, and then engaged in missionary activities, founding some dozen monasteries. David attended a synod at Brefi, Cardiganshire, in about 550 where his eloquence is said to have caused him to be elected primate of the Cambrian Church with the understanding that the episcopal see would be moved from Caerleon to Mynyw, now St. David's. He convened a council, later called the Synod of Victory because it marked the final demise of Pelagianism, and drew up regulations for the British Church. He died at his monastery at Mynyw at the end of the sixth century.
