PIGS IN STAMPEDE

Rushed Through Church-goers
and Caused Plenty of Ex-
citement Yesterday.

Excitement was caused at Fifth and Church streets yesterday morning by a number of hogs consigned to a local abattoir breaking loose and scattering in all directions. The pigs were started west in Fifth street, and just about the time of the stampede the congregation of St. Mary's Church was leaving the edifice.

The pigs, without regard to the piety of the churchgoers, went through the throng, with the result that "Merry Widow" hats were tossed to one side as the pigs plowed their way through the throng.

The hogs continued on their way until Poplar street was reached, when they were driven back into a more orderly fashion and finally sent to the slaughter house.
